Project Description

18th Street between I-205 and NE 136th Avenue was a two-lane substandard arterial with no shoulders, sidewalks, or bike lanes. This project upgraded 18th Street to principal arterial standards including 4 travel lanes, center turn lane, sound walls, frontage road, bike lanes, sidewalks, signals, street lights, signing and striping. The project was split into two phases due to the size and cost of the project. The first phase (I-205 to Four Seasons Lane) was completed in 2012 and the second phase (Four Seasons Lane to 136th Avenue) was completed in 2018. A combination of RTC, TIB, and local funds helped pay for both phases.

Project Benefits

- Improve safety for all modes.
- Improve travel time along the corridor.
- Reduce congestion along east-west arterials in the vicinity caused by growth and a new interchange at I-205 and 18th Street.
