Project Outcome Details

- Enhanced defined access to the Pleasant Valley Park entrance has been constructed, including a HAWK beacon.
- The HAWK beacon and crosswalk provides a defined crossing between the park and WSU Vancouver.
- A dedicated multi-use pathway has been completed for pedestrians and bicyclists, extending the existing sidewalk network for approximately 0.4 miles.
- Pedestrians and bicyclists have been separated from the travel lane, decreasing conflicts with motorists.
- The overall travel experience for all users has been improved and safety has been increased.
